

Jodi Kanter's "Natural Beauties"

Artist Jodi Kanter has woven a world of beauty inspired by the wings of butterflies. The nine hand-woven works in "Natural Beauties" are all based on actual butterfly species. Ms. Kanter has interpreted the characteristic wing-patterns of each in shimmering linen and metallic yarns on a painted warp background. The woven fabric is stretched across six half-cylinders to create a wall relief. A combination of weaving, sculpture and painting, each work is a tribute to the creativity of both the artist and nature.

Award-winning artist Jodi Kanter has been commissioned to create site-specific artworks for Fortune-500 companies, zoos, libraries, hospitals, colleges, sports facilities, and places of worship across the United States. Her artworks grace homes and professional offices throughout Northeast Ohio. Born in Cleveland, she studied weaving at Rochester Institute of Technology, and with some of Europe's most distinguished fiber artists before establishing her own studio. She currently lives and works in Orange Village, Ohio.
